The natural gas industry has already cut methane emissions by over 38 percent and is working to cut more. Imposing a one-size-fits all scheme on the industry could stifle innovation, reduce the production of American energy, cost thousands of jobs, and increase the cost of energy for American consumers

and businesses.
