Re: NV Statewide Poll Findings

Statewide polling in Nevada shows that water shortages and drought issues are a major priority for voters that they want to see elected officials address. Specifically:

Dealing with water shortages and drought is Nevada voters' #1 priority. 64% of voters rated water shortages and drought an extremely important priority, more than rated schools and education (61%), crime and public safety (60%), or the economy (59%) an extremely important priority. A majority rate it an extremely important priority among nearly all demographics, except for Republicans where a 48% plurality rate it extremely important:

Findings are based on a multi-modal phone and text-to-web survey conducted September 26 - October 3, 2022 among n=800 likely November 2022 voters statewide in Nevada, with an additional oversample of n=100 Latino voters. The margin of error for the full sample is +/- 3.5%; for subgroups it varies and is higher. 74% of interviews were conducted via cell phone.
